Legislative bills for Washington State legislature. January 2002

- (1) **Mandatory Mitigation by New Fossil Electricity** - Secured 7 sponsors in Senate and 10 in House; hearings held in House; no votes taken - Passes in 2003 session
- (2) **Creation of State Climate Center** - Secured 6 sponsors in Senate and 9 in House; hearings held in Senate and House; bill passes in Senate 30-18; bill passes House 62-36; Governor signs into law
- (3) **Aggregated Purchasing of Clean Electricity and Vehicles** - Secured 3 sponsors in Senate and 26 in House; hearings held in Senate and House; bill passes in Senate 49-0; bill passes House 98-0; Governor signs
- (4) **“HOV” lanes into “Green” lanes** - Secured 2 sponsors in Senate and 11 in House; hearings held in Senate; Committee passes bill 9-0; no other votes – Variations of proposal persist in legislature post 2002
- (5) **Sales Tax Exemption for High Mileage Vehicles** - Secured sponsorship in Senate; no hearings held

Comprehensive Climate Change Bill providing for

1. Creation of a Central Washington State Climate Clearinghouse
2. Climate Targets
3. Contingency Planning
4. Reporting to the Governor and Legislature

6. Financial Support for Washington State clean technologies
7. Funding by the Emitters

Secured 3 sponsors in Senate; shorter version passes Senate 29-20; no vote in House
